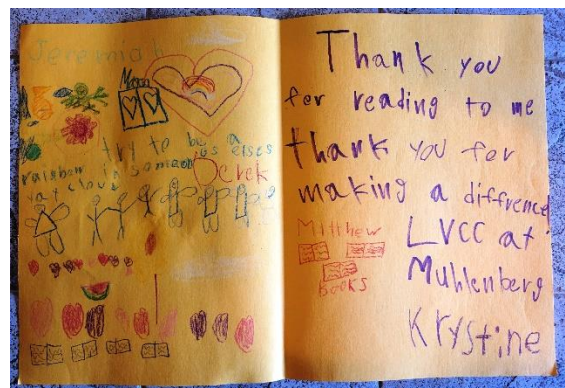

Both serve on its Board of Directors, and Mario is Vice-Chair. HBC is a diversity council of the Greater Lehigh Valley Chamber of Commerce. They provide advocacy for community development issues such as health care, manufacturing, and entrepreneurship. They operate a mentorship program for Hispanic business owners. Mario is owner-operator of AtreQ Entertainment. His ethnicity is Cuban and Puerto Rican. AJ works for LV Public Media, which includes PBS-39 and WLVR 91.3, our local NPR station. Nineteen children are enrolled in that program, but only fourteen were present for the reading session. The children were divided into three reading level groups – grades K-1, 2-3, and 4-5. The Martins met with the youngest children, Joyce and Tom with the middle grades and Terry with the older kids. The children were delightful! They were very happy not to have to wear face masks any more. We enjoyed seeing their faces and bright smiles. The youngest children read a familiar book, “Jabar Jumps.” The 2-3 grade kids read “The Girl Who Thought in Pictures.” And the oldest children received the book “The Locker Ate Lucy.” The books were curated and purchased through Scholastic Books. Personally, I was very impressed with how well the children read in my group. They really got into the story as the group read together. I received similar viewpoints from our other volunteers. The children were very well-behaved and appreciated our visit. We will definitely have to schedule another of these visits in the future! LVCC Picnic



After a two-year absence due to the COVID pandemic, we are preparing for our **12th Annual LVCC Picnic**, to be held on **Thursday, May 12** at the Rose Garden Pavilions on Honochick Drive in Allentown. Once again, **Keith** and **Jessica Reynolds** have generously agreed to plan and sponsor the event. At this year’s picnic, we will host over 160 pre-school children from three LVCC locations in Allentown – the South Mountain, Walnut Street and ELC Centers. Regrettably, due to transportation issues children from

the Union Boulevard Center are unable to attend. Hopefully, next year! We expect that over 50 Key Club volunteers from the William Allen, Allentown Central Catholic, Salisbury, Southern Lehigh, Emmaus and Parkland High Schools will help out. And we already have several members of our Kiwanis Club who have volunteered for set-up, lunch preparation and cleanup afterwards. We could use more! So sign up if you have not already done so. We will be setting up as early as 8:00 AM. The children will arrive between 10-10:30 AM and activities will be from 10:30 AM – 12:30 PM, followed by a picnic lunch. There will be seven activity stations that the children will rotate to, including an obstacle course, parachute game, bubble-making station, musical activity, science experiments and arts and crafts. Following activities we will be serving the children a picnic lunch of hot dogs, chips, fruit snacks, box drinks and cookies. We have invited all of the school mascots to join us, as well as the Just Born Peep, and MeLVin from the Lehigh Valley Phantoms. Once again this years we have reserved all three pavilions for the event. We have looked forward to resuming this wonderful event for the past two years!

A Glance Into Our Past

100 Years Ago – April 1922

At the April 6 meeting, the Kiwanis Club welcomed and honored the 1922 championship Allentown High School basketball team led by Coach John Weimer and included team members captain Harold Helfrich, Andrew Leh, LeRoy Brown, Paul Clymer, Kenneth Weston, Steward Borger, Noland Osmun, John Christ, Clarence Ziegler, Allen Butz, and Clifford Bartholomew. The team won 16 of 20 games. Allentown and Catasauqua were tied at the top of the Lehigh Valley Interscholastic Basketball League. Allentown won a one game playoff with Catasauqua 24-17 to win the league title.

Allentown High School representative, A. C. Lewis, also provided information on the school. The high school was initially designed and built to house 1,200 students. In 1922, the building accommodated about 1,800 students and student population was expected to total over 2,000 with approximately 1,000 in the freshman class.

75 Years Ago – April 1947

The April 10th meeting featured three science teachers and twelve ninth grade students from Central Junior High School. The teachers and students presented a scientific exposition of an imaginary trip to Mars in a rocket ship. A stage was prepared with models of the Earth, Moon, and Mars and a representation of the rocket ship. Sights observed by the crew of the ship were projected on a screen. The students described the imaginary trip and narrated expected adventures on the trip.

50 Years Ago – April 1972

At the April 4th meeting, the Lehigh Medical Society presented its 1972 Benjamin Rush Award to the Club for its community service in the area of health and welfare. Sam Saxton, club president, accepted the award on behalf of the club.

Dr. Joseph Hummel, past club president in 1936 and a 40-year Kiwanian, died at the age of 75 on April 13. He had practiced dentistry for 37 years in Allentown when he retired in 1958.

25 Years Ago – April 1997

On April 26th, club members Karen Nichols and Mike Milligan escorted eight children from Lehigh Valley Child Care to the Smart Museum where the children constructed their own water purification system. The children were also treated to a laser light show. (Note: Does anyone know where the smart museum was? I could not find anything about the “Smart Museum” in Allentown.)
