KI Convention

At the July 11 meeting, **Karen Baker** and **Tom Harp** reported on the 2024 Kiwanis International Convention which was held from July 4-6 at the Colorado Convention Center in downtown Denver. Nearly 1,900 Kiwanians and their guests were in attendance with 1,284 registered delegates. On Wednesday, there was an all-day Kiwanis District Governor Class of 2024-2025 training that Tom was required to attend. The convention officially kicked off on Thursday, July 4 with the traditional parade of flags representing all 85 countries with Kiwanis Clubs. KI President **Katrina Baranko** welcomed everyone.





The Opening Session included an inspiring Keynote Address by former major-league baseball player **Chris Singleton**, whose mom died in the 2015 mass shooting at a Charleston, SC church. His message was "love over hate." There were a number of educational forums that Karen and Tom attended, both Thursday and Friday. There was a Signature Project Breakfast, a Service Leadership Programs Luncheon, and a Kiwanis Children's Fund Breakfast, at which the new "Possibility Project" initiative was launched.

The Keynote Session Friday afternoon featured **Diana Nyad** a 30-year sports journalist best known for her courageous 100 mile swim from Cuba to Florida when she was 64 years old. She was the subject of last year's feature film "Nyad" on Netflix. She spoke on the "Power of Perseverance," having failed three times to succeed in that open-water swim when she was younger. Tom got to meet Diana and had his photo taken with her and Pennsylvania District **Governor Conrad Schlesinger.**



The 2024 KI Annual Meeting and House of Delegates took place Saturday morning, July 6. Amendments and leadership election results were as follows:

AMENDMENTS

<u>APPROVED</u>

- KI Annual Dues increase of \$25.00 per member was approved with 80% of the vote.
- Reduction of KI Trustees from 15 to 12 over a 3 year period.
- Reduction of dues Tier levels from 3 to 2. Now there are only Tier 1 Clubs and Tier 2 Clubs.
- In Districts where there are Trustees (i.e. Pennsylvania), someone from outside a Region can serve in that Region if no one else from that Region is willing or able to serve.

NOT APPROVED

Remote voting by delegates failed again, this time with 60% of the vote.

- Prohibition of alcohol purchases for KI Board members, staff, or spouses/companions.
- Prohibition of first-class or business-class airfare for KI Board members, staff, or spouses/companions.

Our club's delegates at the Business Session on August 17 are **Enos Martin, Karen** Baker and Bob Ashcraft. The convention schedule is very ambitious. It includes an Opening Session with Sharon Mast of Spark Solutions as the Keynote Speaker, and other sessions that will feature **Paul Palazzolo**, Kiwanis International Executive Director, past KI President Bert West, and current KI Vice-President Michael Mulhaul of New Jersey. There will be General Sessions on Membership Growth, Service Leadership Programs, and the Nurse-Family Partnership. A "Lunch and Learn" on Friday will feature a panel discussion on "Combating Youth Homelessness." The convention will offer 12 Breakout Forums. The Governor's Banquet is scheduled for Saturday evening. And at the Kickoff Breakfast on Sunday morning, Tom Harp will be officially installed as Pennsylvania District Governor for 2024-2025! A Glance Into Our Past

100 Years Ago - August 1924

On August 13th, over 200 Kiwanians and guests heard silver-tongued William Jennings Bryan discuss the philosophy of American politics. Bryan gave a promise of another stormy decade ahead for the Democratic and Republican parties. Unsuccessful as a presidential candidate in 1896, 1900, and 1908, Bryan served as Secretary of State under President Woodrow Wilson from 1913-1915. In July 1925, he defended John T Scopes in the infamous Tennessee Scopes Trial. Bryan passed away on July 25, 1925, five days after the completion of the trial.

75 Years Ago – August 1949

The Kiwanis Club announced it leased the Twin Ponds property near Breinigsville for the purpose of providing a summer recreation spot for the use of its sponsored organizations. The Club expected to develop a camp site for the Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Sea Scouts, Cub Scouts, Brownies, and YWCA activities. Kiwanis members could also use the site as a summer retreat. The 8 ½ acre site included a seven-room house with two ponds covering about 2 acres. Today, the location has become a housing development. It is located to the northeast of the end of the Route 222 bypass where Routes 100 and Hamilton Boulevard tie in to the end of the bypass.

50 Years Ago - August 1974

The Club provided three fun-filled outings for the children from Casa Guadalupe. Two bus loads of children, 130 in all, went to Nazareth to tour the Martin Guitar plant and 60 youngsters toured two Lehigh County farms. The club also sponsored 14 children at the Salvation Army camp at Wymart.
