A Glance Into Our Past

100 Years Ago – December 1924

At the Club's December 19th meeting, the members in attendance demonstrated the spirit of Christmas with the collection of over \$400 to provide food, clothing, coal, or whatever was necessary for needy families in Allentown. Club members were told of a family of eight children whose mother had passed away and the father was a laborer. Another family of seven children lost their mother and the father disappeared. These families, along with 23 other families, were given shoes for every family member by Harvey Farr from his shoe store. Another member, Julius Lentz, who owned a flour mill, provided flour to each of the families.

75 Years Ago – December 1949

Continuing its annual Christmas project, the Club held a Christmas Party for 700 underprivileged children at the Earle Theater, located at 20 North 8th Street, on December 24th. After watching a movie, Santa Claus distributed candy, fruit and nuts to all the children. At the Club's Christmas meeting, a group of children from Harrison-Morton Junior High School presented the Christmas story to the attendees and sang Christmas carols.

50 Years Ago – December 1974

Directed by Mrs. Lois Bitler, the Allen High School choral group presented a special Christmas program "Songs for the Holiday Season" during the club's December 19th Christmas meeting.

25 Years Ago – December 1999

The Club sponsored ten inner city children for a Christmas outing at the Burnside Plantation in Bethlehem.
